TRAVEL LOGISTICS

Several carriers serve Buenos Aires daily. Aerolineas Argentinas, United, American, Delta and LATAM - from Miami, Atlanta, Houston, Los Angeles & D/FW. We provide assistance with transfers between the international and domestic airports in Buenos Aires.

The town of **El Calafate**, in Santa Cruz Province is served by several flights a day from Buenos Aires and Córdoba. Deep Patagonia Fly Fishing Base Camp and Arrowhead Lodge are a seven-hour scenic drive in a comfortable vehicle; charter flights can be arranged from a nearby landing strip.

We can assist you with hotels and visits to the magnificent glaciers in the area.

You may choose to overnight in Buenos Aires to tour the city and enjoy one of the many fine hotels and restaurants. Our office can assist you with those arrangements.

WEATHER

Located in the southern hemisphere, Argentina's seasons are reversed (our winter is their summer). Buenos Aires' climate is warm and dry with summer temperatures ranging from lows in the 50s to highs in the 90s. El Calafate's climate is cooler and can be a little windy year-round with summer temperatures ranging from the mid-30s at night to the mid-60s during the day.

FOOD & BEVERAGES

All meals at the base camp are served family style. A breakfast of coffee, tea, fruit, cereal, pancakes, breads, meats and eggs to order are all standard fare. Lunch is served at the base camp. Dinners feature a menu of classic Patagonia cuisine with Argentine asado lamb and beef, trout and pasta dishes – all complemented with Argentine wines.

LANGUAGE

Spanish is spoken as the national language. Your host, guides and staff at the base camp can converse in English and other languages.

GRATUITIES

For the guides and staff, we suggest a cash tip of \$400 to \$500 per person, per week to be paid at the end of your trip. U.S. dollars accepted.

TIME

Argentina is two hours ahead of U.S. Eastern time in the fishing season: Mid-October through mid-February.

FISHING

Fishing for rainbow trout takes place from the base camp in the spawning streams between two remote lakes, and in the spring creeks that flow into the lakes. The fishery is situated on a 25,000-acre private ranch, ensuring that only our anglers have access to the waters. Fishing is accessed via boat and walk and wade. Additional fishing is available from the streams and rivers accessed from Arrowhead Lodge for large trophy rainbow trout.

Large feeding rainbow trout can be seen patrolling the inlet and outlet streams of the lakes. Anglers have many opportunities to sight cast to trophy rainbows. Fish average 22 to 24 inches, with some up to 14 pounds.

CATCH AND RELEASE

In the spirit of sportsmanship and the preservation of world-class fishing, catch and release is mandatory.
